The government drive for closer working of CDRPs and LCJBs has been highlighted in recently published guidance issued from the Home Office and the Office of Criminal Justice Reform (OCJR). In addition the recently published Crime and Disorder Act Review recommends the separation of strategic and operational functions of CDRPs which will facilitate closer working with LCJBs.

This one day conference examines the government objectives for LCJBs as set out in Public Service Agreement 3 and the role of the CDRP in bringing more offences to justice and increase public confidence in the criminal justice system. The conference will focus on the recent guidance and the Crime and Disorder Act Review in relation to closer working of agencies in delivery of the safer communities agenda.
