The Police and Justice Act 2006 introduced a series of minimum standards for crime and disorder reduction partnerships, changing the previous duty to produce an audit every three years to a requirement to produce an annual partnership strategic intelligence assessment (PSIA).

The PSIA should not only review patterns of crime and disorder and substance misuse but also provide an assessment of the likely future impacts of national and local social and economic factors. Included within this are the effects of the economy, policy developments, government initiatives and changes in legislation.

This conference will explore emerging good practice as CDRPs move into the production of their 3rd assessment in the autumn. The conference will provide partnerships with an expert analysis on some national impacts, agendas and policy change that they should consider in planning CDRP strategy reviews and work programmes in 2010/11.
